INTERSCHOOL CHALLENGE

Inter-school Highland Games challenge general information:

Each team will have an adult available who is responsible for them. Helpers welcome. Solid footwear must be

worn.

Competitors will all be coached by the Heavyweight Champions prior to each challenge.

• Competition will be run from 10 – 12pm, teams assemble in the showring at 9 30am for demonstration and practice.

• Teams of up to six students, age and year mix to be decided by schools, so long as all three schools have the same mix.

• * Each competitor will compete in each of the FOUR disciplines i.e., Farmers Walk, Stone Put, Caber Toss and Junior Stones.

• All attempts will be measured and recorded, (only the best attempt per competitor per game will be counted in final score)

• Competitors will be ranked in each section i.e., longest/quickest to shortest/slowest. Points will be awarded to competitors

according to their rankings i.e., 1st = 1pt, 2nd =2pts.

• Team totals will be collated from individual scores, with the team scoring the lowest total declared winner.

There will be an opportunity for non-team members to 'have a go', there will also be novelty games added such as 'hurl the haggis', a relay race, and tug of war if time permits.

Prizegiving is scheduled for approximately 12.45pm providing the challenge has been completed
